ACUTE PSYCHIATRIC HOSPITAL UNITS (APU)

EBENEZER DEPO SAFE SPACE



The City of Cape Town's Community Services and Health Directorate has assembled a team tasked with creating a secure space and shelter for individuals experiencing homelessness in Cape Town. ACG has been assigned the responsibility of designing the facility, ensuring that both the client and the user needs are integrated throughout the development process. The project entails establishing a sleeping area beneath The Helen Suzman Boulevard along Ebenezer Road. Prefabricated units will be implemented to house ablution and administration facilities, alongside external seating, and dining areas. The design's primary goal is to offer a caring environment and foster a positively uplifting atmosphere.

This project is planned to commence contruction early in 2024 and is a Cape Town Mayoral project

With completion of the APUs scheduled for early 2025, we have now reached the midway point in construction, and pleased to report that both sites are progressing smoothly and that the buildings are taking shape, bringing us one step closer to transforming mental healthcare in these regions.

WYNBERG INTEGRATED RAPID TRANSPORT MYCITY BUS DEPOT

Situated opposite Kenilworth Racecourse and accessible via Wetton Road, this site encompasses a wetland and an existing informal dumping ground. These presented various design challenges.

The initiative unfolds in two phases, with the first scheduled for completion by 2025 and the second by 2050.

Phase one encompasses civil works, landscaping, and architectural interventions, featuring a security gatehouse, refuse room, driver rest facility, attenuation pond, kickabout area, and a more formal access road to the Bonnytoun informal settlement at the rear of the site.

The security gatehouse, positioned at the entrance, is a steel portal frame structure clad in sheeting. Its butterfly canopy design facilitates bus entry, while a lower canopy accommodates regular vehicles. The refuse room, a simple face brick structure adorned with open brick patterning, prioritizes natural ventilation, and eliminates glazing elements. Face brick serves as a unifying material across all buildings on the site.

The driver's rest facility serves as a hub for bus drivers to collect schedules and buses, offering a relaxing space before their shifts commence. Constructed with a steel portal frame, face brick panels, and a concrete canopy, the facility embraces an industrial aesthetic. Raw construction materials are intentionally exposed, and the saw-tooth design of the roof captures an industrial vibe, allowing soft south light to permeate the spaces below. Construction is scheduled to commence in early 2025.

ASANDA VILLAGE WETLAND PARK

In October 2023, the construction of Asanda Wetland Park reached its completion. WCB Construction, the contractor responsible for the project, has encapsulated the final outcome in a video. Witnessing the local community's children actively using and delighting in the specially designed space is immensely gratifying. It serves as a tangible testament to the project's success, demonstrating that despite the usual challenges encountered in any undertaking, the efforts were truly worthwhile.



RALLIM HIGH SCHOOL, SUNINGDALE

ACG Landscape Architects partnered with Ruben Reddy Architects for the design and build of Rallim High School. The project involved crafting designs for three internal courtyards and their surrounding external spaces, encompassing outdoor classroom hubs, seating areas, and general planting.

In each courtyard, we incorporated tensile cabling to symbolize light refraction in the mathematics/science courtyard and featured a circular sun portal in the arts courtyard. These cables also serve as support for the growth of climbing plants. Externally, we designed pergolas with seating and outdoor classroom hubs extending seamlessly from the classrooms.

3. Setting New Goals:


As you bid farewell to the current year, it's the perfect time to set new goals for the upcoming one.
